Biography of Roland A. Arteaga

Roland A. “Arty” Arteaga has been serving as the President/CEO of the Defense Credit Union Council (DCUC), since 1 March 2000. In this capacity, he represents the interest of credit unions on military bases worldwide, serving as their primary liaison to the Pentagon.

Over the past eight years, Mr. Arteaga has worked with the Department of Defense on policy and procedural matters affecting DCUC’s member credit unions, and has successfully addressed major issues and actions, such as the Consumer Credit Provisions of the 2007 National Defense Authorization Act (the Talent Amendment) and the Department’s Final Rule and Reports to Congress; the revisions to DoD’s Personal Commercial Solicitation policy; the One Credit Union/One Bank policy; DoD Financial Readiness, to include the revisions to the Department’s Financial Education policy; the revision of the Financial Management Regulation and DoD policy pertaining to non-discretionary “no cost” land leases; the procedures pertaining to Fair Market Value and In-Kind Consideration payments; the development of the Installation Commander’s Banking and Credit Union Liaison Officer’s Desktop guide; the Department’s E-Commerce efforts both on and off the battlefield; Morale Welfare and Recreation sponsorships; matters involving Logistical Support and Base Access policy both overseas and stateside; Training With Industry for incoming Credit Union Liaison Officers; and the Overseas Military Banking Program.

Prior to joining DCUC, Mr. Arteaga served in the United States Army from 1971 to 1999, serving first as an Infantry Officer, then as a Finance Officer and Comptroller.

Key among his military assignments were his tours of duty as the Battalion Commander, of the 230th Finance Support Command, including duty with the 18th Airborne Corps during Operations Desert Shield/Desert Storm...and as the Senior Military Assistant and Executive Officer to the Assistant Secretary of the Army for Financial Management & Comptroller, the Pentagon.

On 1 September 1999, Colonel Roland “Arty” Arteaga retired from the United States Army after 28 ½ years, closing his career as the Commander of the United States Army Finance Command at the Pentagon.

Arty has an undergraduate degree from St Mary’s University, San Antonio, Texas, and a Masters degree from Webster University, St Louis, Missouri. He and his wife, Carol, currently reside in Virginia.
